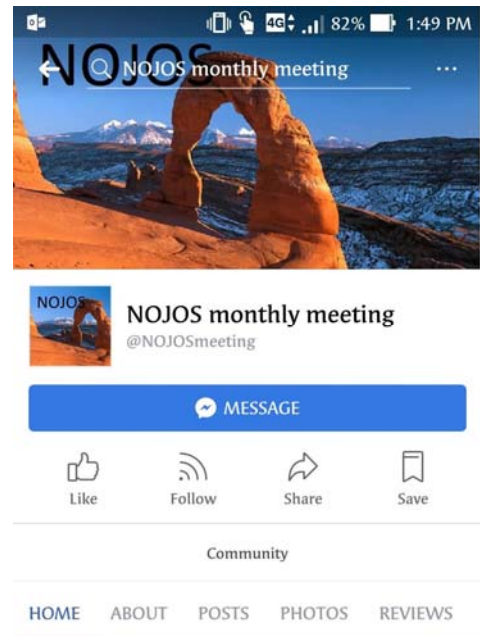


Monthly Meetings

Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) has quickly become a controversial topic in recent years. He draws heavily on his own experience with the disorder, as both an ADD sufferer and the parent of three diagnosed children. Providing a thorough overview of ADD and its treatments, *Scattered* is essential and life-changing reading for the millions of ADD sufferers in North America today.
